

Welcome to **21Things** for Teachers.

This is a self-paced professional development opportunity where you are encouraged to explore and play. The goal of this activity is for you to recognize the value of Web 2.0 resources and tools as a means to improve teaching and learning.

The task is simple. Check it out, play, reflect – each item should take you approximately 20 minutes. You can jump around and complete tasks in any order. Collaborate with others, as needed, but please complete each task yourself so that you can learn from the experience. If you need help, schedule some time with your TRT.

Use this **21Things** document to work through the **21Things**. You can also find the list online at <http://OITMSPD.pbworks.com>. You may not like every tool; hopefully you will find something that interests you. If you can walk away with a few things that make a difference for our students, then it's worth it.

When you complete an item on your **21Things** listed below, be sure to follow the instructions for documenting your work. Most completion evidence includes posting items and/or discussion on “the ning”, <http://ppslearningcommunity.ning.com> . Don’t let the need to post scare you...Every member of the group works for Portsmouth Public Schools. We are all learning together. Remember: although small groups or pairs of items are more easily completed together, these items do not need to be completed in order from 1 - 21. **Seven of the websites (DE Streaming, Animoto, Blabberize, Voki, Wordle, Webspiration and Remember the Milk) will require that you create a free account in order to use the application. You may want to create a free GMAIL account to use to register for these applications.**

Why 21Things??

Our **21Things** initiative is based on a world-wide movement started by [The Learning 2.0 program](#) originally designed by Helene Blowers, Technology Director, Public Library of Charlotte & Mecklenburg County. The original program was loosely based upon Stephen Abram’s article, [43 Things I \(or You\) might want to do this year](#) (Information Outlook - Feb 2006) and the website 43Things. The premise of Blowers’ Learning 2.0 was to engage the library media staff in a self-discovery program that encouraged the

exploration of Web 2.0 tools and new technologies. To make it manageable, she chose activities that could be completed in 15-20 minute sessions.

Portsmouth Public Schools OITMS chose to do **21** "things" as opposed to **23** "things" to emphasize the concept of 21st Century Skills. 21st Century skills such as **critical thinking, problem solving, communication and collaboration** are essential for success after high school. When embedded in core content lessons, information, media and technology instruction can help students develop these 21st century skills. You can learn more about 21st Century Skills at

1. This item has three steps:

 - b. Post a response to the Creative Commons FAQ in the **Creative Commons** discussion on the **21Things** for Teachers group on the ning that includes answers to the following questions:
 - i. What do you think about the Creative Commons idea?
 - ii. How do you think this information might compliment how you give instruction to students with regard to copyright?

Using Photos in the Classroom

- 5. Use the DE Streaming Writing Prompt builder tool to create a writing prompt using an image from DE Streaming. Print the prompt to word and attach it to your post in the **Writing Prompt** discussion on the **21Things** for Teachers group on the ning. In your post explain how you will use the prompt that you created. If you need assistance with this item, be sure to ask your TRT for help.
- 6. Search the creative commons photos at flickr
<http://www.flickr.comcreativecommons/>. Find and download 10 photos related to an SOL that your class will be working on. Attach one photo to

your post in the **Flickr** discussion on the **21Things** for Teachers group on the ning. In your post explain how you will use the photos that you found. If you need assistance with this item, be sure to ask your TRT for help.

7. Create an SOL based “motivational poster” at Big Huge Labs - <http://www.bighugelabs.com> . Use one of the creative commons photos that you found in item 6 along with some essential knowledge from your SOL. Save the poster and attach it to your post in the **Big Huge Labs** discussion on the **21Things** for Teachers group on the ning. In your post explain how you could use one of the photo toys at Big Huge Labs as part of a lesson for your students. If you need assistance with this item, be sure to ask your TRT for help.
8. Create an SOL based video with Animoto - <http://animoto.com/> . Use the creative commons photos that you found in item 6 along with some essential knowledge from your SOL. Save the video and include a link to it in your post in the **Animoto** discussion on the **21Things** for Teachers group on the ning. In your post explain how you could use the Animoto tool as part of a lesson for your students. If you need assistance with this item, be sure to ask your TRT for help.

Using your voice with Web 2.0

9. Go to <http://blabberize.com/> and create a blabber. Embed a copy of the Blabber in the **BLABBERIZE** discussion on the **21Things** for Teachers group on the ning.
10. Go to <http://voki.com> and create your own talking avatar. Choose the “other” embed code to embed a copy of the voki in the **VOKI** discussion on the **21Things** for Teachers group on the ning.
11. Ask your TRT to assist you with this item. Use a Digital Voice Recorder to record a message to the other teachers working on the 21things project. Tell them about one of the activities that you have completed for the 21things project. Your TRT will show you how to use <http://media->

convert.com/ to convert the file to an MP3 file. Attach the MP3 file to you post in the **Digital Voice Recorder** discussion on the **21Things** for Teachers group on the ning.

In your post explain how you could use a podcast as part of a lesson for your students.

Create an Avatar and download it. Attach your avatar to your post in the **Avatar** discussion on the **21Things** for Teachers group on the ning.
